

Bequest Recognition for Reunion Credit and The Grécourt Match

In 1994, Smith established The Grécourt Society to recognize those alumnae and friends who have included the college in their estate plans either by making a provision for Smith in their will or by funding a life income gift. If this is the first time you are notifying us Smith is in your estate plans, we are delighted to make you a member of The Grécourt Society.

Smith College has a bequest recognition policy. It has been created to acknowledge the estate planning of the many loyal alumnae who have shared the specifics of their bequest intentions with Smith, and to give reunion classes recognition and pride in the generous planned gifts of classmates.

For donors in their 50th reunion cycle or older, and for others (Ada Comstock Scholars, graduate alumnae/i, and non-alumnae/i) age 67 or older, Smith will acknowledge recognition credit if the donor documents a **non-contingent** bequest intention of \$10,000 or more for Smith College.

Since many years may pass between the documentation of the bequest intention and the actual receipt of a bequest, Smith will count bequest intentions on a discounted basis as follows for traditional undergraduates:

- 50th reunion 50% of documented beguest intention
- 55th reunion 55% of documented bequest intention
- 60th reunion 60% of documented beguest intention
- And so on

For Ada Comstock Scholars, graduate alumnae/I, and non-alumnae/i:

- Age 67 to 72 50% of documented bequest intention
- Age 73 to 77 55% of documented bequest intention
- Age 78 to 82 60% of documented beguest intention
- Etc.

For documentation purposes, donors must complete and sign the Bequest Recognition and Reunion Credit form on the reverse of this page. Please note that a second form of documentation is required, such as a photocopy of the relevant section of the donor's will, trust, or other estate document.

The Grécourt Match:

- Yes, I wish to participate in the Grécourt Match. 10% of my planned gift will be matched by a current gift from an anonymous member of the Class of 1964 for financial aid (up to a limit of \$10,000).
